

Activity 3: When naming after people what criteria should Council consider when reviewing a naming proposal for a reserve or facility?

Each individual was asked to write their ideas and thoughts on post-it notes, the following was recorded – please note that these are different individual's comments and in some cases are contradictory. Some of the points were discussed further however a specific stance was not confirmed either way on any particular matter.

- Plaques at a location rather than as an alternative
- Place names are long term avoid naming after people
- Don't like names usually except when person dead or don't like using a person's names unless is already named that by community
- Naming okay if donation of land in memory of someone e.g. Husband
- Length of service 20+ years
- Significance of the contribution by person
- Community service over long time related to activity
- Association with locality or use of the facility
- Excellence in community field
- Community contribution rather than personal/ professional
- 40+ years of service week after week
- Set a high bar 20-30 years' service
- Extraordinary service 20+ years
- Status related to use
- Relationship with the facility/ area
- Depends of facility/location
- Must be accompanied with historical information
- Deceased persons only
- Can be alive if inspiring/ significant
- Person should be dead avoid scandal later
