**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY** 

# PURPOSE

To present the key findings of the draft Northern Beaches Employment Study.

### SUMMARY/REPORT

Northern Beaches Council has commissioned SGS Economics and Planning to undertake an Employment Study for the Northern Beaches Local Government Area. This technical study has been undertaken to inform a range of Council projects and strategies including the Local Strategic Planning Statement, Economic Development Plan, Local Environment Plan (LEP), Place Plans, Precinct Plans and Place Activation Plans including Brookvale Structure Plan and Mona Vale Place Plan.

This Study analyses socio-economic data about our community and economy, reviews trends and drivers shaping and changing our employment lands, and takes an in-depth look at our major employment precincts. The study uses zoning suitability analysis, a review of market sales data for industrial, commercial and retail stock across the LGA, demand modelling and gap analysis to provide a range of insights and suggestions to guide the preparation of Council's LEP.

The Study provides a high level strategy and vision for employment lands across the Northern Beaches including precinct-specific directions and planning principles.

This presentation by SGS consultants will outline the key findings of the Study.

Strategic Plan objectives and actions include:

- Leveraging the investment into the health and education precinct at Frenchs Forest and growing business opportunities and activity in the centre.
- Growing investment, business opportunities and jobs in strategic centres, including Brookvale-Dee Why, Manly and Mona Vale.
- Ensuring that industrial and urban services land is planned, retained and managed in recognition of the role and function that industrial lands play in the Greater Sydney context.
- Planning for a city that is supported by infrastructure to enhance local employment opportunities and access to services.
- Facilitating innovative environments where start-up businesses are supported and connected and assisting home-based businesses.
- Activating urban centres to increase economic activity.
- Ensuring the community is stimulated through a range of creative activities, including nighttime opportunities.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

### PURPOSE

To provide an update on the Open Space and Recreation Strategy and community engagement activities and facilitate a discussion on the key themes.

### REPORT

The Open Space and Recreation Strategy project is part way through the idea gathering community engagement stage. Some of the key themes for the Strategy are parks, playgrounds, beaches, off-road cycling, tracks and recreational use of our bushland areas.

An on-line social pinpoint mapping activity and an off-road cycling survey was launched in December 2019 and both close for comments on 16 February 2020. An off-road cycling stakeholder group was established in November 2019 and has its second meeting on 27 February 2020. Further targeted consultation is occurring through the following groups and activities in February and March 2020:

- Groups to be consulted include:
  - Cultural, recreation, community and environment groups
  - Seniors and disability groups
  - Youth Advisory Group (Council)
  - Residents groups and special interest groups
  - Disability, Mental Health and Multicultural Interagency groups
  - Beach user groups
  - Narrabeen Lagoon State Park Advisory Committee
  - Manly Warringah War Memorial State Park Advisory Committee
  - Internal Council stakeholders
  - Consultation methods include
  - Telephone survey (random, stratified), on-line and hard copy surveys
  - Workshops, focus groups, community meetings and discussions at events such as the upcoming Seniors Expo and Lifeline Youth events



Regular Open Space and Recreation Strategy updates will be presented to the Places for People Strategic Reference Group. Also, at key milestones members will be invited to provide feedback and advice.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

### PURPOSE

To provide the Places for People Strategic Reference Group with a presentation on the Northern Beaches Environment and Climate Change Strategy - Protect. Create. Live.

# REPORT

At its meeting on 17 December 2019, Council resolved to adopt the Northern Beaches Environment and Climate Change Strategy - Protect. Create. Live (the Strategy). The Strategy provides a long term vision (20 years) for the environment on the Northern Beaches and delivers the first consolidated environmental framework for Council.

The Strategy contains three major directions which are supported by nine themes (Figure 1):

- *Protect* focuses on protecting and enhancing our natural environment.
- *Create* ensures the environment we create, including our buildings, infrastructure and neighbourhoods, are designed, constructed and maintained with a low environmental footprint and are integrated into nature through green and blue networks.
- *Live* aims to foster a community that is living sustainably in our natural and built environment and a community that is working towards using resources efficiently and reducing carbon emissions. This direction also aims to build resilience in our community to ensure we are prepared for the impacts of climate change and natural hazards.

### ITEM NO. 6.3 - 06 FEBRUARY 2020

The Strategy will be delivered through a series of action plans, which will identify specific projects and actions. These will be short term (two to four years) and will align and guide Council's Delivery Program and Operational Plans.

Evaluation of the Strategy's progress will be undertaken every two to four years. Progress will be measured against all goals, commitments and aspirations identified in the Strategy.
