EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PURPOSE

To update the Transport and Travel Strategic Reference Group on the progress of the Public Exhibition of the Road Safety Plan, and ask members to provide feedback on several aspects of the final document.

REPORT

The Transport Network Team are currently in the public exhibition phase of the project after the Draft Road Safety Plan was endorsed by Council to be placed on public exhibition at the 26 November Council Meeting. The exhibition period was subject to a soft launch in December and the formal 28-day period commenced on the 29 January and closes on the 1 March 2020.

The Road Safety Team have conducted 4 drop in sessions (below) and used the online Your-Say platform to generate feedback on the draft Road safety Plan.

- Dee Why Triangle Park (north), Thu 30 Jan, 9-10am (complete)
- Manly beachfront (at end of the Corso), Tue 4 Feb, 9-10am
- Narrabeen Lagoon (Berry Reserve), Sun 9 Feb, 9-12 noon

- 2. Receive a further update on the implementation of the Northern Beaches Road Safety Plan during 2020 once adopted by Council.





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Our Vision for Road Safety on the Northern Beaches

- Our vision Our vision 'Safe Movement Always' is for the Northern Beaches LGA to be recognised as a safe travel environment for all road users.
- We cannot prevent all road crashes. However, we can all help to reduce the incidence of death, serious injury and the cost of road trauma to the community by adopting a culture of safe behaviour on and around our roads.



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Proposed Actions

Northern Beaches Council will:

Target a reduction in the number of crashes that result in death or serious injury in the local government area. Implement initiatives to encourage a culture of positive and safe behaviour on our roads and paths. Work with Council departments to gain support for road safety infrastructure improvements.

Focus on all road users, but especially vulnerable road users with existing and new road safety campaigns and projects.

Promote, educate and raise awareness that road safety is a shared responsibility and choices and behaviours impact others.

Investigate innovative road safety initiatives, undertake research and development to help change people's behaviour to reduce the risk of crashes.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PURPOSE

Council has requested that Transport for NSW staff attend and provide an update on the project to date and a forward look at the program leading into the transition to opening the new underpass.

REPORT

The Northern Beaches Hospital Road Connectivity and Network Enhancement project is the current project to upgrade access to the new Northern Beaches Hospital and provide additional network capacity on Warringah Road through Frenchs Forest. The work has now been underway for several years and is reaching a significant milestone in the program.

The underpass to take traffic under the Forestway, Hilmer Street and Wakehurst Parkway is nearing completion and it is timely that the Transport and Travel Strategic Reference Group receive an update on the project to date and are provided with a forward look at the next 8 weeks of program and then a high-level timeline to project completion.

Staff have arranged a guest for the project team to present on this topic.
