# 6.3 Water-skiing

- A range of options put forward by the Advisory Committee were discussed.
   The following Options A and B were put to a vote.
- To provide greater access to the entire waterbody for the broader community
- Some Advisory Committee members expressed their concerns regarding noise associated with motor boats and equitable use for the current waterskiing arrangements, e.g. times of use (7 days/weeks, 365 days/year)
- The PoM identifies that the Park is the third most popular facility in the LGA, with 40% residents visiting per annum.
- Acknowledging the need to provide opportunities for a diversity of recreational pursuits the current proposed changes look to reduce water skiing hours, not completely remove.

- 4 Advisory Committee members voted <u>for</u> Option B and 2 members voted <u>against</u> changing the current timetable. Option B was supported by the majority of the Advisory Committee.
- There was then discussion around water-skiing usage on days of significance (ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day) and public holidays.
- 4 Advisory Committee members voted <u>for</u> the proposal that Sunday hours (from Option B) would apply on all Public Holiday days and there would be no water-skiing permitted on both Anzac Day and Remembrance Day, 2 members voted <u>against</u> changing the current timetable. This proposal was supported by the majority of the Advisory Committee.

#### **ACTION**

 That staff prepare a Councillor briefing / report regarding water-skiing at the State Park.

# 6.4 Biodiversity Stewardship Proposal (Beaches Link Offsets)

- Chris Munro and Brendan Smith provided an overview on the Biodiversity Stewardship Proposal
  - Two suitable locations have been identified within the Northern Beaches LGA Manly Dam and one other Crown Reserve location.
  - Council are still in the initial phase of establishing eligibility.
  - A goal is establish a higher level of protection for the environment.
  - A biodiversity conservation agreement on Crown land document was referred to:

#### 7. GENERAL BUSINESS

# 7.1 Mountain Biking

- Geraldine raised a range of matters on behalf of the mountain biking community over the current condition of the mountain bike trail at the State Park and the need for a range of ongoing upgrades, more and improved ongoing maintenance and more / prioritised funding for the trail.
- Steve advised there is \$90,000 for maintenance of the Manly Dam mountain bike trail in the 2021/22 draft operational budget, this is an increase of \$50,000.
- The draft delivery program for the next four years includes \$1 million in 2023/24 for recreational trails of which the majority of funds are planned for Manly Dam trails.
- The final draft mountain bike trail audit has been received and is under review by staff. A meeting is planned with Trailcare 21 May 2021 to discuss the draft and priorities. A report on the audit will be presented to the Advisory Committee once the review of the audit is completed.

#### **ACTION**

- That a report on the mountain bike trail audit is presented at an Advisory Committee meeting once finalised.
- That Council note the matters raised on behalf of the mountain biking community.

 Council has received approval of funding through the NSW Public Spaces Legacy Program for the boardwalk project at the State Park.

# 7.3 Inquiry into the impact of the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link

 Ann tabled the 'Inquiry into the impact of the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link - Terms of Reference' and requested that both the Advisory Committee and Council lodge a submission and the due date is 18 June 2021.
