About this guide

Manly is a popular destination, with beautiful beaches and an impressive collection of world-class restaurants, bars and shops.

The best way to visit Manly is by public transport. It's not only a cheaper alternative to driving but also reduces traffic and pollution. You don't need to worry about finding a parking space and can take your time to enjoy a swim, coffee or long lunch in one of the local restaurants.

Manly is serviced by a number of buses which travel from Palm Beach, Sydney City, North Sydney and St Leonards, to name a few. Ferries run to Circular Quay and Barangaroo. Visit transportnsw.info for information on bus and ferry timetables.

Cycling

There is secure bicycle parking in Whistler Street carpark, Manly. The cost is \$71 per year. This includes access to a bicycle repair kit inside.

There are also bicycle racks in front of Manly Wharf, Manly beachfront, Market Lane and other locations throughout Manly. Would you like to see more bicycle parking in Manly?

Parking stations

Permanent paid parking spaces are available in allocated Council stations, with options available between 2 - 7 days, varying from \$104 - \$411 per month.

Please check Council's website for carpark opening times. Generally parking in Council's four parking stations is open from 6.30am to 12.30am. Whistler Street carpark is open overnight on Friday and Saturday night for an additional \$5.50 fee.

Daytime fee

Entry between 6.30am - 6.59pm

0 - 2 hours*	Free
2 - 2.5 hours	\$11.50
2.5 - 3 hours	\$14.50
3 - 3.5 hours	\$19
3.5 - 4 hours	\$22.50
4 - 5 hours	\$35.50
5 + hours	\$48

*Re-entering or visiting another Northern Beaches Council carpark within 3 hours of exiting will incur fees starting at 2 – 2.5 hourly rate, regardless of the duration of your original stay.

Your fee is determined by your time of entry, you do not transition from daytime to evening after 7pm

Operational Commercial Vehicle Top Up Card

\$27.50 flat fee per weekend day for those that require a vehicle for operational purposes and work within 1km of Manly National carpark. This is not for those who require parking for commuting. This is also available to late night workers who exit the carpark after 9pm on any day - weekdays included.

Evening fee

Entry after 7pm

\$5.50 flat fee

*Please note - there is no free period

Overnight fee

\$5.50 additional charge for vehicles remaining in the carpark after 12am.

Two commercial carparks also exist under Quest Hotel (2.1m) and Manly Wharf (1.9m).

Hop Skip Jump

Council's community bus services operates on a donation made by passengers when they travel. The service operates seven days per week, 8.30am to approximately 5.30pm through the suburbs of Manly, Fairlight, Balgowlah, Balgowlah Heights, Clontarf and Seaforth. There is unlimited street parking available on sections of each route.

Timed parking

There are timed parking zones around Manly town centre including 30 minute, 2 and 4 hours.

Beach permit sticker

Residents and ratepayers displaying a Northern Beaches Council beach parking permit sticker have free parking at more than 40 Northern Beaches' locations.

Manly's beachfront pay and display parking spaces along North and South Steyne are limited to four hours free parking, when your beach parking permit is displayed.

Pre-paid parking PCYC carpark, Dee Why

There is pre-paid parking offered on a short and long term basis at PCYC carpark, 40 Kingsway, Dee Why. The carpark is open from 5.30am - midnight Monday - Saturday and 6.30am - midnight Sundays and public holidays. It is a secure carpark and is locked shut every night.

There is a B-Line stop with buses that service the Northern beaches including Manly.

The casual fees are:

Up to 3 hours per day*:	Free
3 - 4 hours	\$3
4 - 5 hours	\$4
5 hours +	\$ 5

*Vehicles re-entering after using their 3 hours free parking will incur fees starting at 3-4 hour rate.



Short Term Parking

There are private companies that offer short term parking options for those visiting. They are often app or web based and can help customers find available parking spaces in real-time.



Park&Ride -B-Line Buses

To qualify for free Transport Park&Ride parking, you must:

- Be the holder of a valid Adult, Child/Youth, Gold Senior/Pensioner or Concession Opal card
- Park in a dedicated Transport Park&Ride car park
- Tap on and tap off with your Opal card to complete a trip on public transport
- Use the same Opal card to tap out of the car park within 18 hours of entering

There are Transport Park&Ride carparks at Balgowlah and Manly Vale where the 199 bus goes straight into Manly.

Motorcycle parking

Motorcycles can park for free in the designated motorcycle parking areas in the Manly parking stations. Any motorcycles parking in a vehicle bay are subject to the full fees and charges. Fines may apply to any motorcycles parked in a vehicle bay that exits without paying.

Motorcycles parked in a pay and display bay or permit zone must display either a valid parking permit or a pay and display ticket.

Accessible parking

Visitors with a valid mobility parking permit may park for free at any pay and display council carpark.

They are also able to park in any timed bay of over 30 minutes for an unlimited amount of time. Please refer to RMS guidelines.

Mobility permit holders are still subject to the same fees and charges in the Manly pay stations (those carparks operated behind a boom gate).
