#### **ISSUE**

Members of Council's Youth Advisory Group will deliver a presentation to the Committee on the outcomes of Have Your Say Day 2023.

#### **BACKGROUND**

This item relates to the following Community Safety Plan action:

Develop a Youth Discussion Paper to identify youth specific needs and challenges and to inform the delivery of youth programs. (Priority Area: Safe Communities)

The second annual Have Your Say Day forum was held on 4 May 2023 at Glen Street Theatre. Have Your Say Day is a youth-led forum facilitated by the Beaches Leadership Team, a network of school leaders from schools across the Northern Beaches, and Council's Youth Advisory Group (YAG).

At this forum, student leaders from local schools and the Youth Advisory Group underwent training in appreciative inquiry provided by youth peak body Youth Action NSW, providing student leaders with a strengths and solutions based way to present on social, economic and environmental issues. Students then presented on a range of issues facing young people on the Northern Beaches to an audience including local, state and federal elected members, school teachers and students.

As a youth led initiative, Have Your Say Day aligns with Council's Youth Voice Action Plan, endorsed by Council on 18 April 2023.

Youth representatives will present to the Committee on the community safety related concerns raised by young people at Have Your Say Day 2023 and there will be an opportunity for the Committee to engage in discussion on these matters.

Council is seeking advice from the Committee on any opportunities to address the concerns raised by young people from Have Your Say Day 2023.

#### **ISSUE**

This is a standing item on the agenda for the Community Safety Coordinator to provide an update.

#### **BACKGROUND**

#### Police and Council Operational meeting

A meeting was held on 15 June 2023 with the following key topics of discussion:

- Upcoming events to August 2023 including Citizenship ceremonies, Vietnam Veterans Day, NAIDOC Week and Bloody Long Walk Palm Beach to Manly.
- 24 hour outdoor dining furniture and Youth Outreach Working Group update.
- Community member correspondence regarding East Esplanade and bike thefts at Manly Wharf
- Discussed locations including Narrabeen Park Lagoon Trail, Forty Baskets Beach, Forest Way Overpass, The Grove, Seaforth, heavy vehicles in Dee Why and bus stops.

The next meeting will be held on 10 August 2023

#### Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Working Group

Work is continuing on the development of a:

- Webinar for service providers
- New Council webpage with resources for victims/survivors of sexual assault, and services responding to disclosure of sexual assault.
- Support Guide for local service providers and victims/survivors outlining referral pathways.

#### Northern Beaches Suicide Prevention Working Group Update

The Working Group met on 3 May 2023 and discussed means restriction initiatives at key locations and received an update from NSW National Parks & Wildlife Service regarding the new North Head lookouts and Fairfax walking track, which reopened in April 2023.

The male focused subgroup met on 12 July 2023 and are developing a resource on local men's groups and services for promotion and distribution at a local Men's Breakfast run by Lifeline Northern Beaches on Wednesday, 11 October as part of Mental Health month.

The Northern Sydney Suicide Prevention Working Group met on 19 July 2023. The Group is investigating other collaborative models to provide a stronger and more inclusive governance framework. The Northern Sydney Local Health District is establishing a process to share suicide monitoring data (SuMS Data) with partner organisations with an identified need for access.
