ITEM 6.3 LGBTQIA+ WORKING GROUP UPDATE - 30 MINUTES

ISSUE

To update the Committee on the progress of the Northern Beaches LGBTQIA+ Working Group (the Group) and seek advice and input into safety related strategies and actions.

BACKGROUND

Council's Community Safety Plan (the Plan) adopted in September 2021 identified an action relating to the local LGBTQIA+ community, to:

'Develop a working group to explore safety issues relating to LGBTQIA+ community, with a focus on younger people.'

Expressions of Interest (EOI) were open from 1 February to 28 February in the lead up to Sydney WorldPride 2023. To ensure the Group had diverse and balanced representation, the EOI sought up to 2 community members per Council Ward and up to 3 community organisations, with a focus on lived experience, connections to the local LGBTQIA+ community, and young people.

The purpose of the Group is to identify strategies that make the Northern Beaches increasingly safe, inclusive and welcoming place for all, over a 12 month period from June 2023 to June 2024.

The Group was established in June 2023 with 9 community representatives across 5 wards, 3 representatives from community organisations and Council staff from diverse teams, coordinated by staff in the Community Development team.

DISCUSSION

Since June 2023, the Group has met bimonthly and made the following progress:

- Development of Terms of Reference to clarify the purpose and intended outcomes.
- Discussed and collated the key issues and experiences of the LGBTQIA+ community on the Northern Beaches.
- Identified four main outcome areas to inform development of actions and strategies.
- Developed draft actions and strategies towards identified outcomes.
- Met with relevant Council staff to discuss and refine draft actions.
- Identified key external stakeholders and developed an engagement plan for early 2024.

Members of the Working Group will attend the Committee meeting to present on the safety related issues and proposed draft actions and strategies to address them and seeking feedback and input from Committee members.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Committee note the information received and participate in a workshop on the proposed safety related strategies and actions.

ISSUE

The Community Safety Coordinator will provide a mid-term review to the Committee on progress in implementing Council's Community Safety Plan 2021-2026 (the Plan).

BACKGROUND

The Northern Beaches Community Safety Plan 2021-2026 is an important tool to help realise Council's vision of '...a safe, diverse, inclusive and connected community that lives in balance with our extraordinary coastal and bushland environment'.

This Plan activates the 'safe' direction of Council's *Better Together* 2040 Social Sustainability Strategy and contributes towards the vision of Council's Community Strategic Plan - Shape 2028 for a 'safe, inclusive and connected community'.

The Plan provides a five-year roadmap for Council and the community to maintain and improve safety for all residents of the Northern Beaches. It outlines the actions that Council, service partners and the community are currently taking, and will take over the period 2021-2026 to build on our responsiveness to community safety issues.

The Plan has 10 Priority Areas and a range of Actions to achieve the outcomes of Safe Places and Safe People (Attachment 1).

Improving community safety requires all sections of the community to work together and build partnerships to create a safer environment for people to work, live and play. Council takes a collaborative approach to community safety and crime prevention and has been working with a range of stakeholders to progress actions under the Plan.

A mid-term review of progress against Community Safety Plan actions will be provided to the Committee, together with discussion on 2024 priorities.

ISSUE

BACKGROUND

Police and Council Operational meeting

A meeting was held on 7 December 2023 with the following key topics of discussion:

- Upcoming events to February 2024
- Community member correspondence regarding:
 - Manly Waves Hotel
 - Seabeach Gardens Retirement Village
- Discussed locations including:
 - West Esplanade
 - Walter Gors Park
 - Baringa Reserve Seaforth
 - Avalon
 - Manly Beach

A further Police Council Operational meeting was held on 8 February 2024. The key topics of discussion will be provided to the Committee in the update presentation.

The next meeting will be held on 4 April 2024.

Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Working Group

The Working Group met on 1 February 2024 to progress arrangements for the professional development webinar: Supporting victims and survivors of sexual assault scheduled for 21 February 2024. This webinar is intended to support local services providers to respond to disclosures of sexual assault.

Suicide Prevention Working Group

The Northern Sydney Suicide Prevention Working Group met on 15 November and continues to make progress towards endorsing a new Terms of Reference for improved Collaborative Governance.

The Youth Response Team operating out of the Mona Vale Hospital was discussed. Dr David Gordon, clinical lead with the Northern Sydney Local Health District, specialising in child & adolescent and addiction psychiatry, will be invited to the next meeting to report on their youth response model of care.

The male focused subgroup met on 1 November 2023 to review the evaluation of the recent Men's Breakfast.



ITEM NO. 6.5 - 15 FEBRUARY 2024

A total of 83 people attended the event: 57 community members and 17 stall holders. Feedback was very positive overall. 93% of survey respondents indicated that their level of awareness of local men's groups had increased from attending the event.

Discussion focused on the role of role of GPs in the referral of Mental Health plans and the exploration of more safe spaces. The resource has been distributed and promoted on Council website. Lifeline Northern Beaches will develop targeted training opportunities for men's groups. Tailored mental health training to CALD communities was discussed. A follow-up survey with the men's group / breakfast attendees will be conducted in February and April to inform future actions.

RECOMMENDATION
