4.0 AGENDA ITEMS

4.1 INCLUSIVE COMMUNITIES DISCUSSION PAPER

DISCUSSION

Hannah Schulz-Fulham, Community Development Officer addressed the group on this item. A copy of the discussion paper provided to the group is attached to the meeting notes (Attachment 1.)

DISCUSSION

It is encouraged that all members prepare and submit feedback due by 30 June 2017 for the July Council meeting which will be handed over to the new Council in September. You will have the opportunity to comment on the document as a whole and on all areas across Council.

Questions arising from the discussion

- **Q:** In regards to public transport, can the Hop Skip and Jump service be investigated and implemented from Mona Vale to Church Point to assist our residents and visitors.
- A: Transport is a State Government responsibility and therefore the role of Council should be to lobby for additional services where needed. A solution could be additional funding for community transport options such as the Hop Skip Jump service.

Items to be reviewed and possibly included in the discussion paper are as follows:

- <u>Social isolation and community connectedness</u>
 - Investigate whether Hop Skip and Jump service could be extended to meet demand outside of manly, for instance running from Mona Vale to Church Point as the B Line service will not extend that far.
- Access to public spaces and community facilities:
 - An issue was raised around the suggestion of market stall infrastructure in the public

domain. It was expressed that in small community business areas such as Avalon, market stalls selling wares in a shopping district can be at the detriment of existing businesses. It was agreed that market stalls should complement the existing business offering and have a community rather than an economic focus.

- There was support for festivals and events that showcase culture and promote diversity in the community.
- <u>Access and Inclusion</u>
 - Agreed that there were financial and red tape barriers to putting on event. For example, insurance.
- <u>Community participation and leadership</u>

Council should support volunteer opportunities that connect existing groups.

• There was support for the suggestion of increased Council resources to assist with the promotion and management of volunteers in addition to our current Volunteer Coordinator position which focuses predominately on internal volunteer positions. This staff member could become a central point to assist with managing volunteers. A volunteer portal could be created where community members could access information about organisations and their current volunteer availabilities. Barrier with working with current Working With Children Check and the ongoing changes to this matter. This makes it hard to volunteer and deters people. This extends out to aged care and other areas.

DECISION

- 1. That the Inclusive Communities Strategic Reference Group provide further comments on the draft discussion paper to Hannah Schulz-Fulham prior to June 30The group commended Hannah Schulz-Fulham for a well written paper.
- 2. That two or three of members of the Inclusive Communities Strategic Reference Group attend the Council meeting and address this item.

4.2 DISABILITY INCLUSION ACTION PLAN - UPDATE

DISCUSSION

Lindsay Godfrey, Executive Manager Community Services addressed the group on this item.

All NSW Councils are required to develop and adopt a Disability Inclusion Action Plan (DIAP) by 1 July 2017, in order to meet their legislative responsibility under the Disability Inclusion Act NSW (2014). The overall aim of the four year plan is to develop and implement actions that will improve the lives of people living with disability.

The Northern Beaches Council draft DIAP was placed on public exhibition for 28 days.Fifteen submissions were received. The submissions covered a wide range of topics under the four focus areas: attitudes and behaviours; liveable communities; meaningful employment; and systems and processes. The topics that received the most interest included playgrounds, road safety and beach access. Very few changes were made to the draft DIAP in response to the submissions, although there were many proposals warranting further investigation by Council. The final draft DIAP can be



found at Attachment 1. A summary of submissions and Council responses can be found at Attachment 2. This report also details procurement opportunities for the employment of people with disability through the increased use of social enterprises.

A result of the meeting and exhibition period incorporated an amendment to the document which was as follows:

Council staff integrate methods for the employment of people with disability into Council processes through increased use of social enterprises.

DECISION

The Inclusive Communities Strategic Reference Group noted the information update on the Disability Inclusion Action Plan.

4.3 AFFORDABLE HOUSING POLICY ADOPTION

DISCUSSION

Lindsay Godfrey, Executive Manager Community Services (Operations) addressed the group on this item.

The Chief Executive Officer formally adopted the Affordable Housing Policy on 5 June 2017 following Council's resolution on 30 May 2017 (Item 9.7). The resolution included a requirement for the Affordable Housing Policy to be brought back to Council for review in 12 months.
