## Have you considered giving your bulky goods a new life?

Most bulky goods items collected will be compacted, crushed and sent to landfill.

Consider the many ways you can sell, recycle or upcycle before you book your collection service.

Find tips to reduce your waste and where to recycle / reuse items locally via northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au or scan the QR code.

## **Bulky Goods Collection Service**

Households can pre-book two bulky goods collections of a maximum 3 cubic metres per booking in a 12 month period. If you live in a unit or townhouse, please contact your Body Corporate, Strata Manager or Property Manager, as most multi-unit dwellings have pre-booked communal collections. **Material must only be placed out the night before the collection date.** Residents may be fined if they dump material on other booked collections or place it on the kerb without making a booking.

Please note the following prior to placing out your goods for collection:



**Doors are removed** from all whitegoods and **large items dismantled** 



Rolled and tied carpets max 1.8 metres long (max 3 rolls)



Metal items should be placed in a separate pile for recycling. Check website for other items that can be recycled via your bulky goods collection



Maximum 12 fence palings



Residents must have a booking confirmation number **before** materials are left out for collection



Ensure **nails are not protuding** from any items



Items must **not be longer than 1.8m or heavier than 40kg** (except white goods)

Place bins out the night before collection day

**Consider** composting or mulching vegetation for use on your garden



- O Vegetation
  Fortnightly collection
- Branches max 75mm thick
- Leaves / weeds
- Garden / grass clippings
- Cut up palm fronds
- Twigs
- Flowers
- Food / general waste
- Boxed vegetation
- Plastic bags\*
- Building / furniture timber
- Soil / animal faeces
- Large tree stumps

#### How do I present my bins?



To ensure collection:

Items must be in the bin with the lid closed flat.

Bins should be on the kerb 20cm apart and lid opening facing the street.

Maximum bin weight:

- 80L bin 40kg
- 140L bin 70kg
- 240L bin 70kg



Please do not overfill or jam waste in the bin or place waste on top or beside the bin. This may result in your bin **not** being serviced.

Where possible, place bins clear of obstructions. If someone does park in front of your bins, don't worry they will still be emptied.

Please contact Council to **report a damaged or missing bin,** or if you see any **illegal dumping. Report dumped shopping trolleys** to trolleytracker.com.au/report
