What to do with soft plastics

Did you know you can recycle soft plastic packaging such as bread bags, frozen food and veggie bags, old 'green' bags, cereal box liners and other soft plastics at your local Coles or Woolworths supermarket? Your Waste & Recycling Guide

- Place bins out the night before collection day and bring them in within 24 hours
- Bins should be on the kerb, at least 20cm apart and lid openings facing the street
- Items must be in the bins and the lids closed flat to avoid litter

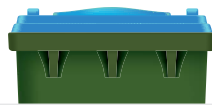

Lime Green Lid Fortnightly Max 4 bins

- ✓ Garden / grass clippings
- ✓ Leaves
- ✓ Branches max width 75mm
- ✓ Cut up palm fronds
- ✓ Twigs
- ✓ Flowers

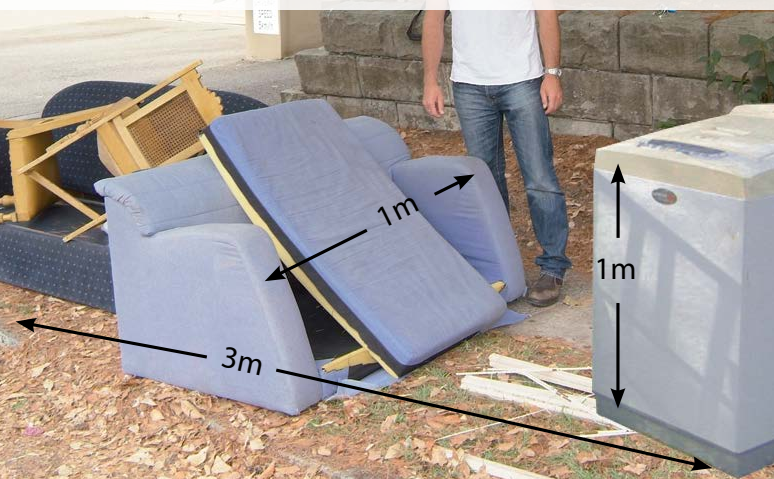

- ✗ General waste

Make separating your recycling easy with our free reusable bags, available from Customer Service Centres.

Please note:

- Make sure nails are not protruding from items
- Remove doors from fridges for safety reasons



Bulky Goods Clean Up

- ✓ Maximum amount is 3 cubic metres, similar to a small box trailer
- ✓ Large items must be disassembled so they can be loaded by two people
- ✓ Place all metal items in a separate pile for recycling
- ✗ TVs & computers
- ✗ Building / renovation material
- ✗ Car parts, tyres & batteries
- ✗ Gas bottles & extinguishers
- ✗ Vegetation
- ✗ Cardboard & paper
- ✗ Windows / glass / mirrors

Council collects bulky goods from your neighbourhood twice a year. We'll notify you with a letterbox drop three weeks before the collection date. We don't publish scheduled collection dates in advance in order to deter dumping.
