A Message from the Mayor



The Northern Beaches is home to some of the world's most spectacular beaches and we have a proud history as a major surfing destination.

The world's first surf boat was launched at Manly in 1907,

Manly hosted the first World Surfboard Riding Championships in 1964, and Manly-Freshwater had the honour of being listed as Australia's first ever World Surfing Reserve – protected for its historical, cultural, economic and ecological significance.

Significantly, North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club celebrates its 110th anniversary this month – one of the oldest surf clubs in Australia. Best wishes to all the club officials and the many, many volunteers who have made this club so successful over so many years.

Sadly, Manly's annual Australian Open of Surfing lost critical funding last week which means it won't proceed in 2018. We have been actively pursuing a replacement event and I met with local member James Griffin this week to see what support the State Government can provide in order to keep a major surfing event running at Manly. More news on this to come.

Another significant milestone is coming up – 99 years since the end of the First World War. Remembrance Day on the eleventh day of the eleventh month each year provides an opportunity for us all to remember those who have fallen in wars and conflicts around the world and think of those still in conflict. I encourage you to attend one of the many events being held next Friday and Saturday both by Council and RSLs across our region.

Finally, a note on transport. I know that getting in, out and around the Northern Beaches is a major issue for many residents. Since Council has announced the development of a transport strategy, State and Federal members are also advocating for change. We welcome ideas and funding and look forward to making this a priority in the coming months.
