The state government changed the state planning rules to put a cap of 12 units on new boarding

house developments in low density residential areas. That's finally a win for common sense and will prevent a proliferation of 100-unit developments in quiet suburban streets that we were being asked to assess and had little power to reject.

Thanks to those in the community who stood with Council in our many representations to the state minister and department to get this change across the line. We have some existing applications we will still need to fight but it's good to know that any future applications will have to adhere to the new 12-unit
