

A message from the Mayor



Next Thursday we commemorate Anzac Day.

It is always a sombre day, as we remember all Service Men and Women who have served our nation and the incredible sacrifice they have all made to

protect our way of life - they have all sacrificed their time and their innocence and for too many of them, the ultimate sacrifice was made. Over the course of that "Great War" alone from 1914 to 1918, seventy-seven-thousand Australian and New Zealand sons and daughters would lose their lives on foreign soil.

And sadly the peace of the post-War era was faltering and short-lived - only to crumble a mere 20 years later to another brutal world war.

Since then we have seen the world dragged into more wars, conflicts and terrible acts of violence, too often filled with hatred, fear and bigotry.

We were all reminded of that by the awful events in Christchurch, only a month or so ago.

Yet, from the coastal sands of Anzac Cove - to the desert sands of Iraq - Australia and New Zealand have stood together in defence of fundamental principles - faith in democracy, the rule of law, peace between nations and respect for human rights.

Anzac Day has come to symbolise the unshakeable bonds of friendship and those core values that link Australia and New Zealand and which have endured for more than a century. Over recent years, I've been really moved to see the New Zealand National Anthem being sung at more and more events and the Kiwi flag being flown alongside our own. It's a reminder of that bond and of our common shared values.

There are many events being held across the beaches over the next week to mark Anzac Day and particularly on Thursday, including dawn services and marches. I hope to see you at one of them.
