With the beach patrol season officially ending last Sunday, I thought I would take the opportunity to acknowledge the fantastic work by our professional Council lifeguards as well as volunteer lifesavers across the Northern Beaches.

No lives were lost during patrol hours across our 21 beaches stretching from Palm Beach to Manly, a wonderful effort from all involved.

It shows the importance of expert training, with a number of incidents which required basic first aid or resuscitations dealt with promptly and professionally. Thanks to all involved.

Elsewhere, on Tuesday night, six students made their way to the PCYC Northern Beaches in Dee Why to reflect on their recent time in far western NSW, Brewarrina.

In what was described as an 'unforgettable experience', teenagers Noah Sawyer, Eliza Lo Russo, Luka Vajdic, Davis Koorey, Aleta Wassell and Bianca Aiello recently swapped the beaches for a week in outback New South Wales.

They were the envy of many on their return and rightly so - after all, how many local residents can say they stopped by to see the world famous opal mines at Lightning Ridge or learnt the secrets of the Brewarrina fish traps which stretch back 40,000 years - in under a week?

The cultural journey for the students is part of Council's City Youth Exchange program, with the primary aim to forge lasting friendships between beach and bush communities.

Finally, our 2019/20 budget is out on public exhibition and I encourage you to get along to one of the many info sessions to make sure you get all the facts. It's a responsible budget which delivers a massive \$99 million capital works program, ensuring we maintain and renew our assets as well as provide the events and services that make living on the Northern Beaches even better.

Plus it shows we will achieve and reinvest an estimated \$161.6 million in savings over 10 years, exceeding those promised by amalgamation, and continue to shave millions more off our inherited debts. And with our new waste collection service coming online we'll not only be improving service and providing environmental benefits but many residents will actually see lower charges too.
