Warringah Golf Course, Condamine St, Manly Vale - proposed lease term extension

Under s47A of the *Local Government Act 1993*, we intend to extend the lease term with Warringah Golf Club Limited ACN 000 085 601 for one year, from 1 Sep 2019, for the land known as Warringah Golf Course (Lots 1 & 7 DP829465 - part Lots 2742 and 2743 in DP752038), being part of the land in Certificate of Title Volume 13394 Folio 147.

On 16 Apr 2019, Council resolved to authorise a 20-year lease to Warringah

Golf Club Limited. The one-year extension will ensure a lease remains in place whilst the terms of the 20-year lease are finalised.

The purpose of the lease is for a golf course and associated uses.

Warringah Recreation Centre - proposed licence extension

Under s47A of the *Local Government Act 1993*, we intend to extend the licence term by one year, from 1 Sep 2019, for the land known as Lot 3 Deposited Plan 829465 at 433 Pittwater Rd, North Manly.
