

A Message from the Mayor



The Northern Beaches community is pretty special. Thanks to those who have sent messages of support to me and our staff during this time. We thrive on positives as a community.

In an otherwise challenging week, it was great to welcome more than 100 locals as new citizens after they

discovered the world's best kept secret – the Northern Beaches.

COVID-19 (coronavirus) is here with us and in the news every day. Council's senior staff and I continue to meet every day including across the weekend as things evolve and change, following the advice of our lead state and federal government agencies.

The safety and wellbeing of our staff and community are at the centre of our response.

Yes, we've had to cancel many events, programs and workshops and close a number of much loved facilities.

We understand that these decisions have a huge impact on our community and I want to tell you they have not been made lightly. We need to comply with the 1.5m social distancing required by the Federal Government and that has huge ramifications for the way we operate.

Be assured that our decisions are being reviewed daily and we will reopen all our facilities - aquatic centres, galleries, theatre and our three closed libraries - as soon as we can.

Our focus is on maintaining essential services like waste collection, childcare, road maintenance and Meals on Wheels. And we are putting in place a range of measures that will support the most vulnerable and help our local businesses.

Manly, Warringah Mall and Mona Vale libraries remain open. Monday to Friday, 9-11am has been set aside for customers with a disability, older and vulnerable people and their carers; after 11am others are welcome. We're also expanding our home library service and will offer a Click and Collect book service.

To assist the business community who are already feeling the pressure, we have developed a \$1.2million Business Support Plan to compliment those of state and federal governments. It includes fee waivers, flexible delivery and parking arrangements and business marketing support.


Council is doing what we can to support local business during these tough times ahead and I hope you all will too. It's as simple as two words: 'shop local'.

We are a very resilient community and while we are in unprecedented territory, we are all in this together. Please check in on your neighbours, support each other and follow advice from health authorities.
